SCHOOL FEES: 2022-23

The Board approved the proposed school fees for the 2022-23 school year, which outlines how fees are charged

for optional courses; noon supervision; extracurricular and activity expenses, such as field trips; and noncurricular goods and services. Parameters were set by the Board of Trustees to ensure students achieve quality

education, but also to ensure fees are not cost-prohibitive for families. Now approved, schools will post fees on

their individual websites for the 2022-23 school year. The Division will also update school fees on its website by

the end of May 2022 (see pg. 64, "2022-23 School Fees").

For the 2022-23 school year, the Division expects slightly lower student registration numbers than in fall 2021—decreasing to 16,942 students from 17,124 students.
