100% of last year's Gr. 6 students wrote all of the PATs!

LITERACY & NUMERACY INITIATIVES

- Acceptable results increased by 0.9% (93.3 to 94.2)
- Excellence results increased by 7.2% (36.0 to 43.2)
- 100% of students met the acceptable standard in English Language Arts
- AEL students scored around 20% higher than the Provincial average in most subjects.
- **Leveled Literacy Intervention** small group instruction for students who need a boost to get to grade level in reading
- Focused & targeted reading instruction for at risk readers in every classroom
- Precision reading programs and Wee Read programs supporting emergent readers
- Math benchmarking assessments identifying areas for growth for students at risk in math
- Hosted our 3rd annual Math Family Fun Night in October
