Official Languages in Education Protocol (OLEP)

Funding Formula Change and the Impact to French Second Language Programs

Alberta Education recently made changes to the OLEP Funding Formula for 2019/20 as well as changes to the formula for the 2020/21 school year. This will negatively impact French Immersion and French Second Language Programs (11.5% to 27% cuts in funds). What is important to understand is that the total OLEP funding amount has not changed, but how it is distributed has.

As a result of recent decisions made by the Government of Alberta, the **University of Alberta's Campus Saint-Jean is in jeopardy of losing 44% of it's course offerings.** CSJ is currently the only post-secondary French language institution west of Manitoba. Another significant challenge to CSJ which impacts FSL students of all grades and in all corners of the province, is that Campus Saint-Jean is the main source of Alberta's French-speaking teachers and the only source of French-speaking education assistants.
