### **COVID Protocols:**

- Masking
  - o Recommended that students wear medical-grade masks
  - Students may remove masks when eating or playing outside at recess
  - O Students may choose to wear masks during physical education, but it is not required
  - Masks cannot be removed even when facing forward.
  - Staff are required to wear medical grade masks.
- Cohorts- Grade level cohorts are continuing to happen.
- Cleaning- cleaning regime by EIPS including high touch surfaces and electrostatic spraying.
- Clubs- Temporarily paused
- Volunteers- Yes!
  - Vaccination QR code verification & confidentiality forms
  - Medical grade masks are required (available in the office)
  - No contact with anyone who is currently positive for COVID-19
- Field Trips- Can continue if they can remain in their grade cohort.

- Online Learning- We may be required to switch to temporary online learning if absentee rates are too high and affect school operations.
- Notifications for COVID-19- No longer receive notifications. To continue to keep our school safe, please inform your classroom teacher or Mrs. McNeely if your child has tested positive.
- Government Supplied Rapid Tests & Masks
  - We haven't received them yet.
  - We are planning to have parents communicate to teachers re: how they wish to receive the kits through a Google Form (backpack or arrange an alternate time for pick up)- The tests are no longer effective if they freeze.

#### Celebrations:

- Food Bank donations were a huge success! We collected through our Giving Tree, candy cane draw for non-perishable foods & Hot Lunch raised \$1000
- Clubs have been a huge success. They are momentarily paused, but we can't wait to start them up again.
- Holiday Cheer (Ugly Christmas Sweater Day, Pajama Day, Visit from the Grinch, Carolling in classrooms, Leader on the Ledge)
- Christmas performances for each class was shared through Brightspace
