E. Trustee Report - Susan Miller via Tandy Atchison

At the February 23rd Board Meeting, the Board approved up to \$5,000 to sponsor the registration fees for school council

members to attend the ASCA School Councils Conference and Annual General Meeting on April 21-23 – one member

per school. To qualify, members must be part of a school council with an active ASCA membership and apply before the registration deadline of April 6.

March 5-7 th, the Board attended the Alberta Rural Education Symposium held in Edmonton. Trustees from all over the

province came together to discuss issues with Education in a rural setting. The themes were resilience, reconciliation and

rejoicing. A few schools shared the challenges they have faced these past few years and some creative solutions they

have implemented. Speakers at the event shared various ways to support students and families.

The recent provincial budget was good news for education, with significant increases in areas that school boards have been

advocating for. This includes almost \$2 billion of increased funding over three years to hire more teachers and aides.

increase support for students who need more help, and funding to address the transportation issues.

Transportation could look a little different soon!

The province has proposed boosting next year \$\%#39\$; school transportation funding by 24 per cent, and requiring schools to offer

busing to students who live closer to their schools. Education Minister Adriana LaGrange said school boards, parents,

teachers, and students have said the current limit of 2.4 kilometers was too far for children to walk. The distance will be

lowered to 1 kilometer for students in Graded 1-6 and 2 kilometers for Grades 7-12, beginning September 2024.

Also, as part of the province's 2023 budget, the government announced that they are proceeding with the construction

of a new school in Sherwood Park to replace Sherwood Heights and Ecole Campbelltown. The last budget covered the

design phase and we were waiting to receive news of commitment for actual construction of the building. Sherwood

Heights has been on Elk Island's capital project list for more than 10 years. Once the designs are finalized, we will be moving Into the construction phase.

Nominations for the Strathcona County Awards of Excellence are open now! These awards recognize residents of the county for their
