

What do the first few days of Kindergarten look like?

Staggered start allows Kindergarten students (and parents) to get used to the school and find their class with a small group of peers.

Starting Off Right with a Staggered Start

Schedule A (Monday/Wednesday) students have their staggered start on:

- August 31 OR September 2 (only on one of these days)
- First full day for M/W students September 7 (Early Dismissal).

Schedule B (Tuesday/Thursday) students have their staggered start on:

- August 30 OR September 1st (only on one of these days)
- First full day for T/Th students September 6

You will receive an email with your child's staggered start date and time in June!


School Fees



Did you know?




Early dismissal days (8:40am-2:16pm)

Early Years Evaluation – Teacher Assessment (EYE-TA)

- Administered in the fall
- Uses teachers' regular observations and informal assessments
- Helps determine a child's progress and development in five key areas
 - Awareness of self and environment;
 - Social skills and approaches to learning;
 - Cognitive skills;
 - Language and communication; and
 - Physical development
- Assessment findings used to help plan instruction and will be shared with parents at the first progress reporting term in November
- Parent sessions providing more details and explanation will be available in the fall





School Supplies

School supply lists will be available on ardrossanelementary.ca in June.

Tools for School is a program from the United Way that provides backpacks filled with school supplies to students in kindergarten to Grade 12 whose families have limited resources. The supplies provided may not be everything that's on your child's supply list, but it's a start.
